Our Literacy Coaches' Reading Corner

*Solving Words Within the Tex*t

In order to read a text proficiently, readers need to

be able to recognize most words instantly and effortlessly. However, all readers come across words that they do not recognize or need to decode. When readers come across an unfamiliar word, they need to have a wide variety of strategies to take the word apart and figure it out. Some strategies include: saying the word slowly/sounding out the word, looking for familiar word parts (base words, roots, prefixes, suffixes, etc.), and using context clues.

Readers will sometimes ask about a word before they've made an attempt to figure it out. When your reader comes to a word they don't know, give them the chance to solve the word on their own. If they are still struggling ask them the following questions:

- What do you see at the beginning (middle, or end) of the word?
- What sound does that letter make?
- What word makes sense here? Does that look right?
- Is there a part of the word that you know?

If your child still struggles to solve a word after prompting, tell them. If they are struggling with many of the words on the page, they may not be ready to read that book yet - and that's okay! Help them choose another book that they can be successful with.
