
Urbana Elementary Climber

Title I - 2019-20 School Year Wrap-up

Schoolwide Title I is a federal program that provides aid to schools to support at risk students. Federal dollars flow according to poverty levels and students qualify according to test scores, end of unit tests, and teacher recommendations. Our schoolwide Title I program is an ongoing comprehensive plan for school improvement that is owned by the entire school community. During the 2019-2020 school year, Title I services provided reading and math support across grades K-8, depending on the level of need. The district uses both pull-out instruction for small group settings and an inclusion model within the regular classroom setting. Current programs that support Title I goals include LLI, Reading Recovery, and Title I Instruction with General Fund support. Our Title I federal allocation for the 2019-2020 school year was \$552,547.48. The majority of this funding goes toward the salary and benefits of our Title I teachers and paraprofessionals. Funds are also used for supplies and professional development, as well as community engagement activities. A family literacy night was planned for this year, but we were unable to hold the event due to the school closure order. Parents are encouraged to be involved with our Title program through parent-teacher conferences, event nights, and the annual review of our parent involvement policy. As summer vacation approaches, families look forward to many wonderful events. Summer activities provide valuable experiences in which


children learn about themselves and the world around them.


Now THIS is putting sidewalk chalk to good use!







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Got a Yearbook?


Unfortunately NOT yet!
