2022 Summer School Camp

Urbana City Schools will be offering a different kind of summer school for our K-2 students this year. In order to meet the specific needs of our students, we will be infusing math, reading, science, and social studies learning with engaging, hands-on instruction that promotes critical and creative thinking by using a PBL (Project Based Learning) approach. Students will complete one (1) project per week for a total of four (4) weeks. Kindergarten Registration for 2022-2023 School Year

Urbana City Schools offers all day, every day kindergarten for children turning five (5) **before August 1, 2022**. If you have or know of anyone who has a child who fits this description, we are encouraging parents to register him/her for kindergarten for the 2022-2023 school year.

There are two (2) steps to enroll your child in kindergarten at UES:

<u>Step #1</u>: Fill out your registration forms online on *FinalForms*. This can be done from home or at the **Urbana City Schools Board Office**, <u>711 Wood Street, Urbana</u>, Monday-Friday between the hours of 8:30-3:30 pm. Once all of your registration forms have been completed on *FinalForms*, a screening appointment at the elementary school will then be made for your child.

Step #2: On your child's screening appointment day, you will need to bring in the following documentation: child's certified birth certificate, child's immunization record, parent/guardian driver's license, proof of residency (utility bill or rental/lease agreement), and custody paperwork (if applicable) to complete/finalize your child's kindergarten registration. Screening will take place in the gym at the Urbana Elementary building, 1673 US Hwy 68 South, Urbana and will take approximately 20-25 minutes. Parents will wait in an assigned area until the child is finished with screening.

You <u>must</u> complete ALL registration forms on *FinalForms* and bring ALL documents to your child's scheduled screening appointment to complete enrollment. Screening dates for 2022-2023 enrollment are: **May 23, 24, 25, 26** with summer dates on **August 2, 3,** and **4.**

TITLE 1 Year End Wrap-up

Schoolwide Title I is a federal program that provides aid to schools to support at-risk students. Federal dollars flow according to poverty levels and students qualify according to test scores, end of unit tests. and teacher recommendations. Our schoolwide Title I program is an ongoing comprehensive plan for school improvement that is owned by the entire school community. During the 2021-2022 school year, Title I services provided reading and math support across grades K-8, depending on the level of need. The district uses both pull-out instruction for small group settings and an inclusion model within the regular classroom setting. Current programs that support Title I goals include LLI and Title I Instruction with General Fund support. Our Title I federal allocation for the 2021-2022 school year was \$439,612.28. The majority of this funding goes toward the salary and benefits of our Title I teachers and paraprofessionals. Funds are also used for supplies and professional development, as well as community engagement activities. A family literacy night was held on Thursday, May 5th with support from Title 1. Parents are encouraged to be involved with our Title program through parent-teacher conferences, event nights, and the annual review of our parent involvement policy. Our Literacy Coaches' Reading Corner

About the Text Thinking

This type of thinking occurs when readers are analyzing and critiquing.

This thinking involves opinions about the text and recognizing how things like genre and text features help the reader better understand the text. Some questions to ask your reader to help them think about the text are:

- What genre do you think this book is? How do you know?
- What did you notice about how the author wrote the book?
- What did you notice about the illustrations (diagrams, tables, pictures, etc.)?
- How did the illustrations help you understand the story better?
- Why is the title a good one for this book?
- What did you like/dislike about the book?
- What was your favorite part and why?
