A Family Guide to EMOTIONAL EMPOWERMENT From our K-5 School Counselors, Mrs. Lingrell and Mr. Dorsey

Regulate strong emotions through individual coping strategies.

Regulating stressful emotions helps keep them from taking over in our minds and causing the loss of our sense of control.

How grown-ups can help. Share your own coping strategies and introduce your child to calming techniques they can use, like deep breathing, listening to music, counting, or physical activity.

Kindergarten Registration for 2022-2023 School Year

Urbana City Schools offers all day, every day kindergarten for children turning five (5) **before August 1, 2022**. If you have or know of anyone who has a child who fits this description, we are encouraging parents to register him/her for kindergarten for the 2022-2023 school year.

To register your child for Kindergarten through Urbana City Schools, please follow the steps below. You may begin this process starting on Monday, April 11, 2022.

- 1. Visit the Urbana City Schools website at: www.urbanacityschools.org
- 2. Under Quick Links on the left hand side, click "FinalForms/KDG Registration"
- 3. Follow the directions as listed

After you have completed ALL of the online forms, you will need to call Robin Miller at (937) 653-1402 Option 1 between the hours of 8:30 am and 3:00 pm to schedule an appointment for a screening time. All online forms must be completed before you can schedule your screening appointment.

On your child's screening day, you will need to bring with you the following documentation: child's immunization record, parent/guardian driver's license, proof of residency (utility bill or rental/lease agreement), and custody
paperwork (if applicable) to complete/finalize your child's kindergarten registration. Screening will take place in the gym at the Urbana
Elementary building, 1673 US Hwy 68 South, Urbana and will take approximately 20-25 minutes. Parents will wait in an assigned area until the child is finished with screening. Screening dates for the 2022-2023 enrollment year are: May 23, 24, 25, and 26.

Our Literacy Coaches' Reading Corner

Predicting -Beyond the Text

When reading a text, efficient readers

will predict what is coming next to help decode words and decipher meaning. Readers will already have expectations surrounding a text based on the genre and topic and maybe even the author and illustrator. The knowledge of how language and texts work help readers navigate the story structure and narrows down possibilities to decode the words on the page. When thinking about what they are reading, a reader will predict what will happen in the story based around what is happening in the text, as well as prior knowledge they have surrounding the text/topic. Here are some questions to ask your reader to help activate their thinking surrounding prediction:

- What do you know about how this book works?
- What structure are you noticing in this book?
- Look at the cover and read the title. What do you think might happen in this book? Why do you think that?
- What do you think the character may do next?
 What makes you think that?
- Did your prediction come true?
