TITLE 1 Year End Wrap-up for 2021-2022 School Year

Schoolwide Title I is a federal program that provides aid to schools to support at-risk students. Federal dollars flow according to poverty levels and students qualify according to test scores, end of unit tests, and teacher recommendations. Our schoolwide Title I program is an ongoing comprehensive plan for school improvement that is owned by the entire school community. During the 2021-2022 school year, Title I services provided reading and math support across grades K-8, depending on the level of need. The district uses both pull-out instruction for small group settings and an inclusion model within the regular classroom setting. Current programs that support Title I goals include LLI and Title I Instruction with General Fund support. Our Title I federal allocation for the 2021-2022 school year was \$439,612.28. The majority of this funding goes toward the salary and benefits of our Title I teachers and paraprofessionals. Funds are also used for supplies and professional development, as well as community engagement activities. A family literacy night is planned for Thursday. May 5th from 6:00-7:30 pm. Parents are encouraged to be involved with our Title program through parent-teacher conferences, event nights, and the annual review of our parent involvement policy. A Family Guide to EMOTIONAL EMPOWERMENT From our K-5 School Counselors, Mrs. Lingrell and Mr. Dorsey

Emotional Empowerment at Home. A calming basket can provide a go-to strategy for coping with stressful feelings. With your child's help (and during a time they're not under emotional strain), collect materials using suggestions below and place them in a basket or container that is easily accessible. Explain to your child that items in the calming basket may be used in a "feelings emergency," when an emotion is hard for them to manage. Encourage your child to come to you when they feel the need to use the calming basket to reinforce the skill of communicating all types of feelings first.

Suggested Calming Basket Items: *Stuffed animals, putty or modeling clay, paper that can be crumpled up, stress balls, puzzles, favorite books, a coloring book and crayons, and a fidget spinner or pop-it toy.*

For older kids, provide them with a blank "Feelings Journal" to write anything they need to let out whenever emotions feel overwhelming or confusing.

Kindergarten Registration for 2022-2023 School Year

Urbana City Schools offers all day, every day kindergarten for children turning five (5) *before* August 1, 2022. If you have or know of anyone who has a child who fits this description, we are encouraging parents to register him/her for kindergarten for the 2022-2023 school year.

To register your child for Kindergarten through Urbana City Schools, please follow the steps below:

Visit the Urbana City Schools website at: <u>www.urbanacityschools.org</u>

- 1. Under Quick Links on the left hand side, click "FinalForms/KDG Registration"
- 2. Follow the directions as listed

After you have completed ALL of the online forms, you will need to call Robin Miller at (937) 653-1402 Option 1 between the hours of 8:30 am and 3:00 pm to schedule an appointment for a <u>screening</u> time. All online forms must be completed before you can schedule your screening appointment.

On your child's screening day, you will need to bring with you the following documentation: <u>child's certified birth certificate</u>, <u>child's immunization record</u>, <u>parent/guardian driver's license</u>, <u>proof of residency</u> (*utility bill or rental/lease agreement*), and <u>custody</u> <u>paperwork</u> (*if applicable*) to complete your child's kindergarten enrollment. Screening will take place in the gym at the **Urbana Elementary building**, <u>1673 US Hwy 68 South</u>, <u>Urbana</u> and will take approximately 20-25 minutes. Parents will wait in an assigned area until the child is finished. Screening dates for the 2022-2023 school year are: **May 23, 24, 25,** and **26.**

Our Literacy Coaches' Reading Corner

Making Connections -Beyond the Text

There are many different

ways readers make connections before, during, and after the reading of a text. Connections can occur between two texts, the reader themselves and a text, or the world and the text. All readers will have a slightly different interpretation of a text based on their own personal experiences. Our experiences allow us to make connections with the message of a story, a character, or a situation. Readers also analyze text and realize they can make connections to other texts they've read concerning message, theme, characters, setting, illustrations and much more. Understanding that things that happen in a text can also happen in the world we live in helps readers make larger connections. Some questions to ask your reader to help them make connections are:

- What does this book remind you of?
- Have you ever felt like this character did? Tell me about it.
- What other books does this one make you think of?
- Tell me about a time you....(situation in the book).
- How is this book different from others you've read?
